



Road to Recovery



Anne Arundel County Department of Health

- Provides mandated, delegated and locally-initiated public health services to Anne Arundel County
- Program falls under the Behavioral Health Bureau



Opioid Treatment

- Two community OTPs located in Annapolis and Glen Burnie
- One OTP operating out of the Ordnance Road Correctional Center
- Mobile low threshold buprenorphine induction program



Conception



The Maryland Opioid Operational Command Center (OOCC) announced the Examination and Treatment Act Grant Program

- Funding for local jurisdictions to increase the availability of treatment and other services for opioid use disorder (OUD) in county detention centers
- Established to support local jurisdictions in implementing the requirements of the OUD Examination and Treatment Act (ETA), also known as House Bill 116 of 2019.

Established Treatment Options


- OTP at Ordnance Road Correctional Center offering methadone and naltrexone
- Deliveries of methadone to Jennifer Road Detention Center
- New Admissions to inmates at Ordnance Road Correctional Center Only

Expanded Treatment Needs

- Implementing buprenorphine as a treatment option
- Expanding admissions to Jennifer Road Detention Center

Creating a proposal for a mobile narcotic treatment program

- Visited other programs using mobile treatment vans
- Consulted DEA NTP guidelines
- Obtained initial quotes from mobile vehicle design businesses
- Created initial drafts of a mobile unit





Proposal



Submitted Proposal for Examination and Treatment Act Grant Program (ETAGP)

- Proposal Included:
- Ford Transit Cargo Van
- Mobile Medical Van Customization
- Salaries for 2 additional staff (Full time counselor; Part time nurse)
- Additional materials, supplies, training, and equipment



Implementation

2022

August Department of Health awarded ETAGP funding

- Began meeting with TechOps Speciality Vehicles
- Finalized sketch of the vehicle along with DEA NTP regulations to include the placement of the safe, dosing area and security of the vehicle
- Obtained initial quotes and timeline for completion of the project


